

RAINWATER HARVESTING REBATE PROGRAM

Amended November 18, 2020

OVERVIEW

1. Program Description

Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District (PGCD) offers a financial incentive to encourage rainwater harvesting. Rainwater harvesting in Texas is regulated by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). All systems must adhere to TWDB's guidelines and to the <u>Texas Health and Safety Code §341.042.</u> For more information, visit <u>www.twdb.texas.gov/innovative</u> water/rainwater/faq.asp

PGCD currently offers two financial options for the rainwater harvesting program.

Option 1: Funds will be calculated at \$0.50 per gallon of storage capacity not to exceed 50 percent of the total system.

Option 2: Applicants may apply for a loan, putting 10 percent down of the total system cost, and pay the District back over five years at an interest rate of two percent.

2. Program Eligibility

- 1. Applicants must be the landowner or tenant of the project location in the District.
- 2. Participation in the program is limited to once every fiscal year (Oct. Sept.).
- 3. Projects over \$5,000 are subject to approval by PGCD Board of Directors.
- 4. Funds are available for new systems or existing systems seeking to expand storage capacity. However, applicants applying for new systems will take priority over applicants making additions to installed systems.
- 5. Applicants receiving funds from a different entity, for the same project, may apply but will only receive up to 50 percent of the remaining system cost.

3. System Requirements

- 1. Participants are required to send a yearly estimate of gallons of water collected with the system.
- 2. Tanks 2,000 gallons and larger require the installation of sturdy and level base constructed of gravel, sand or concrete. Wooden or above ground platforms are not permitted for large cisterns.
- 3. Transparent or translucent collection tanks and piping must be painted or enclosed to prevent penetration from sunlight (a black colored tank is recommended).

4. Rebate Amount and Application Instructions

Steps for participation vary based on storage capacity.

Instructions for Systems collecting 2,000 gallons or less

- 1. Purchase and install a rainwater harvesting system.
- 2. Apply and submit receipts within 30 days of purchase.
- 3. PGCD may schedule a system inspection to verify installation prior to issuing rebate.
- 4. Pictures of system must be included with application.

Instructions for Systems collecting more than 2,000 gallons

- 1. Prior to purchases, apply and submit a plan (including quotes) for review.
- 2. Applicant will be notified of approval status and availability of funds.
- 3. Purchase, install and submit receipts for the system within 90 days of approval.
- 4. PGCD will schedule a system inspection to verify installation.

5. Real World Numbers

One inch of rain in a one square foot space equals .623 gallons of water captured.

For Example:

15 in. of rain x 1,500 sq. ft. roof space x .623 gallons = 14,017 gallons of captured water
