1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

President Chancy Cruse called the Regular Meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

No public comment.

3. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON MINUTES FROM DECEMBER 14, 2023

Director Breeding motioned to approve the December 2023 Regular Meeting minutes, seconded by Director Sinclair. The motion passed unanimously.

4. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON EXPENDITURES FOR DECEMBER 2023

Director Breeding motioned to approve the December 2023 expenditures, seconded by Director Hodges. The motion passed unanimously.

5. 2023 ANNUAL WEATHER MODIFICATION EVALUATION REPORT -Presented by Dr. Arquimedes Ruiz-Columbie

Dr. Arquimedes Ruiz-Columbie was unable to attend the Regular Meeting.

Director Bowers motioned to table the 2023 Annual Weather Modification Evaluation Report for a future meeting, seconded by Director Sinclair. The motion passed unanimously.

6. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE 2022-2023 FINANCIAL AUDIT

-Presented by Allen & Ortega

Arturo Ortega with Allen & Ortega Certified Accountants presented the 2022-2023 financial audit to the Board and expressed that the District finances are healthy with a clean opinion. He explained that property taxes provide 85% of the District's total revenue, and the District had another good year. Mr. Ortega also noted that the District has approximately 2.5 years of reserves and he had no concerns at this time.

Director Spearman motioned to approve the 2022-2023 Financial Audit, seconded by Director Breeding. The motion passed unanimously.

General Manager Britney Britten stated that the District is waiting on transport and production reports from Brice-Lesley.

Director Sinclair motioned to accept the quarterly production reports, seconded by Director Hodges. The motion passed unanimously.

Director Bowers motioned to error off taxes which are one dollar or less in Carson County for the 2023 tax year, seconded by Director Sinclair. The motion passed unanimously.
